Re: ABX2-3 (Gallagher): Gasoline Specifications -- Oppose

Dear Chair Petrie-Norris and Committee Members,

The undersigned organizations oppose ABX2-3 because it would weaken standards that protect Californians from air pollution and climate change.

Section 1. Exempting Oil Companies Would Render California's Greenhouse Gas Cap Ineffective.

Transportation accounts for by far the largest share of California's greenhouse gas emissions – roughly 50%, when upstream emissions are included, according to the Air Resources Board. Therefore, removing transportation fuels from the cap would fatally damage the program.

Section 2. Waiving Fuel Standards Could Undermine Health.

As the Energy Commission pointed out in its Transportation Fuels Assessment, introducing gasoline that does not meet California standards "could impose a negative pollution effect and potential risk to federal air quality attainment standards," and those specifications "are included in the federally required State Implementation Plan for air quality and cannot be weakened without identifying substitute emission reductions." The language in ABX2-3 does not address those serious problems.

## Section 3. Weakening Volatility (RVP) Requirements Would Increase Smog.

Gasoline specifications are a crucial part of California's battle against the smog that continues to choke our people. The Reid Vapor Pressure requirements reduce evaporative emissions during our many warm months. Weakening those requirements by shifting to a winter blend when much of the state still experiences high temperatures means increasing the smog that is already by far the worst in the U.S. As the CEC noted, this option "could increase evaporative emissions and ozone levels for at least those two months, with potential persisting effects for several months."

CEC also pointed out that this strategy brings "increased risk of violation of federal air quality attainment standards and related sanctions or litigation," and "RVP and other gasoline specifications are included in the federally required State Implementation Plan for air quality and cannot be weakened without identifying substitute emission reductions."

Gas prices spike for many reasons, including the greed of big oil companies. The lungs and health of our children, seniors, and other sensitive populations should not have to suffer as a response to those price spikes.

For these reasons, we oppose ABX2-3 as being an inappropriate, unfair and unhealthy response to high fuel prices.
